#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

## What is Academic Advisement?

• Academic advisement is a structured support system available to every student when making important academic decisions related to his/her course, electives, and academic progress in general.

#### Who is a Registered Student?

- A student (advisee) will be considered "registered" when he or she has:
- Accepted the offer of admission
- Paid the commitment fee by the stipulated date
- Selected Modules (Using Module Selection Guide)
- Paid all fees and charges prescribed by the University by the stipulated date
- Agreed to the terms and conditions governing the University

### What is my responsibility as a student/advisee?

- Students (Advisees) are required to:
- Access and read information provided in the Student Handbook and be familiar with the policies, guidelines and expectations
- Be knowledgeable of your degree requirements, and other college policies and procedures
- take an active role in the development of meaningful academic goals
- Establish communication with your assigned advisor, and arrive prepared and on time for advisement appointments
- Seek assistance when navigating issues surrounding a module /course (academic demands, withdrawal from a module/course, leave of absence)
- Be aware of all college deadlines, i.e. withdrawal date, transfer application deadlines, appeal deadlines. etc.

#### Who is an Academic Advisor?

• An academic advisor is a full-time lecturer from Academic Unit (College/Course of study) within University.

## What services does the Academic Advisor offer?

- Advisors offer a wide range of services such as:
- Organizing an initial meeting with advisees to exchange contact information and explain the academic advisement process, regulations and services offered by the College/University
- Providing guidance related to academic problems considering University expectations, policies and procedures
- Providing assistance in deciding how to meet the demands of your course and modules
- Advising students on the selection of appropriate modules to successfully complete the course of study in a timely fashion
- Evaluating and monitoring students' academic progress Promoting student development and growth by assisting students in assessing their interests, abilities, and shortand long-term educational goals
- Helping students explore academic options and career pathways
- Empowering students to become self-sufficient and independent learners through the creation of academic schedules that allow them to balance academic and personal responsibilities

## What can I discuss with my academic advisor?

- General University Matters Add/drop, Registration, Transfer of credit or academic records, Grade point average/grading policy, Financial status, Services provided by Institution e.g. financial, Counseling etc., Leave of absence, Withdrawal from module/Course of Study, Request for Transfer, Grade forgiveness, Independent study
- Course of Study Matters Module Diet, Selection of modules, Clashing of module(s), Failure of module(s), Redo of module(s), Elective(s), Academic probation

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#### How can I get information about my academic advisor?

- You can view the name of your assigned academic advisor on your Student Portal!
- You can also get this information from the College Office by speaking with the Student Affair Representative(s).
- You can also contact the academic advisement unit of the College or one of the representatives from your school.
- How am I assigned an academic advisor?
- As a student you are randomly assigned to an academic advisor by the College academic advisement Unit. That Lecturer will continue to be your advisor throughout your academic career in the University.

#### Can I change my Academic advisor?

 Sometimes, an issue of incompatibility may arise between advisors and advisee's. In such case, either the advisor (lecturer) or the advisee (student) may request a change by completing a form available in your school office or on the UTech, Jamaica website. You can also email the advisement unit of the college to request the form.

#### What can I do if I am placed on academic probation?

- It is important that advisees on academic probation report regularly to their Academic Ädvisor.
- The student should meet with his/her Academic Advisor to discuss issues or challenges that have placed him/her on academic probation, or are likely to place him/her on academic probation.
  The Academic Advisor will then discuss the
- possible solutions with the advisee and decide on a plan of action to address the challenge(s). The Academic Advisor will also discuss with the advisee how he/she plans to re-do any failed modules.
